Originally from Tegucigalpa, Honduras, Alba moved to Des Moines more than twenty eight years ago, now calling Iowa home for her children and grandchildren. While in Honduras, Alba studied Foreign Languages (English-French), Pedagogy at the Universidad Nacional Autónoma de Honduras - UNAH. In 2012 Alba became the Executive Office of Latino Affairs where some of her primary duties include serving as the central permanent agency to advocate for Latino persons, coordinate and cooperate with the efforts of the state departments and agencies to serve the needs of Latino persons in participating fully in the economic, social, and cultural life of the state, and to provide direct assistance to those who request it. During her tenure at the Greater Des Moines Partnership (2000-2012) Ms. Perez was charged with programming educational, networking and recognition opportunities on issues of diversity and inclusion for member companies and community.
